10 AIDS Service Groups Get \$5K 'Holiday Hugs' From Campbell

Ten groups that provide direct HIV/AIDS services in Florida received a "Holiday Hug"—a \$5,000 year-end grant to use as they see fit—from the Campbell Foundation, which is known for funding private HIV-related laboratory-based research.

Including this year's gifts, the foundation has awarded \$1 million to direct services organizations (see the graphic above for a breakdown of the year-end grants). This is in addition to its grants for research. According to a Campbell press release, the "hugs" are a way to say thanks to the organizations for directly helping people living with and affected by HIV.

In total, the foundation has provided \$10 million in funds since it launched in 1995.

This holiday season, the groups that received \$5,000 Holiday Hugs are all located in Florida. They include:
